### Welcome to Project Season!

Healthcare Coalition Members,

I hope that this month's newsletter finds you well and in good health. Thank you for your continued efforts over this past year's challenges. It is that time of year when the Coalition opens up the project funding process for the upcoming fiscal year 2021-22. With the experiences and challenges that we have all faced over the past year, we are confident that all of our HCC membership has identified gaps, lessons learned, and best practices that can be developed into a project to enhance or build new capabilities with your respective organization.

To be eligible to apply for project funding, there are two main requirements. You must have a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) in place, and participate or attend at least 50% of your respective county coalition meetings.

Once you have your MOA in place, you will be able to access all of the project guidance and submission information on the [TBHMPC website](#). Here you will find information that will help guide you through the project application process. It outlines what documentation is needed to complete your project application packet, what constitutes a "clean" project submission, an acceptable quote, and provides some examples of past accepted projects, along with unaccepted project submissions. These are just some examples and we encourage you to examine the lessons learned and gaps identified with past experiences to identify your needs.

What does your facility, organization, or agency need in the way of training/education or physical assets to close those gaps by either enhancing existing or creating new capabilities? If you are new to this process, or just need some guidance, the Coalition is here to support you and ensure your success in the funding application process.

Your final project submissions are to be submitted to your County Chair for processing and ranking, prior to submission to the region. Projects are due to your County Chair No Later than;

## Important Updates & Resources

### EXECUTIVE ORDER NUMBER 21-79

As of Monday, April 5, all Florida residents shall be eligible to receive any COVID-19 vaccine as prescribed by the Food and Drug Administration.

**PERSONS AGES 16-17:** The Pfizer vaccine is authorized for persons age 16 and up. The Moderna and Janssen (Johnson and Johnson) vaccines are authorized for persons age 18 and up. All individuals under the age of 18 receiving a vaccine must be accompanied by a guardian and complete the COVID-19 vaccine screening and consent form. ## Dr. Martin's Minute

### COVID-19 vaccination for teens likely before next school year

Pfizer announced on 3/31/21 their Phase 3 results for the two dose COVID-19 vaccine. The study enrolled 2260 participants and was a placebo controlled trial. In the placebo group (n=1129), there were 18 cases of COVID-19. **No cases of COVID-19 were reported in the vaccine group (n=1131) for an efficacy of 100%.** Interestingly, this group appeared to mount a more robust immune response than the 16-25 year old group in the larger phase 3 trial previously released. Geometric mean titers (GMT) was used to determine neutralizing antibody response and the level for the 12-15 year olds was 1239.5, which was higher than the 16-25 year olds at 705.1, though the clinical implications of these values isn't clear. The vaccine was well tolerated, with symptoms similar to the older 16-25 year old group.

Per the press release, Pfizer plans to amend their current Emergency Use Authorization with the FDA to include this age group. More data will be released with the peer reviewed scientific paper in the future. Aims appear to be many children in this age group potentially being vaccinated this summer, and returning to school fully protected.


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## Florida Tropical Training




## Homebound Residents
