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As we start 2021, a main focus in our health and medical community is certainly [COVID-19 vaccination](#). While doses are rolling out slowly, a great deal of planning and activity is taking place. In this month's newsletter, we will provide you with a snapshot and resources to keep you informed on local vaccination efforts.

The Basics

There are 2 vaccines currently with Emergency Use Authorizations by the FDA—the [Pfizer](#) and [Moderna](#) vaccines.

While similar [mRNA vaccines](#), there are different requirements in storage and timing for second doses. There are 3 [additional vaccines](#) in phase 3 clinical trials in the US but none on the immediate horizon for EUA approval.

Vaccination Plans in Florida

Florida's current plan, based on [EO 20-315](#), involves providing vaccine for 4 priority groups: Health care personnel with direct patient contact, long-term care facility residents and staff, persons 65 years and older, and persons deemed extremely vulnerable to COVID-19 by hospital providers. If you have questions about how your organization fits into these groups and vaccination efforts, please contact your local County Health Department.

Important Updates & Resources

Emerging SARS-CoV-2 Variants

Multiple SARS-CoV-2 variants are circulating globally. Several new variants emerged in the fall of 2020, most notably:

- In the United Kingdom (UK), a new variant strain of SARS-CoV-2 (known as 20B/501Y.V1, VOC 202012/01, or B.1.1.7 lineage) emerged with an unusually large number of mutations. This variant has since been detected in numerous countries around the world, including the United States and Canada.
- In South Africa, another variant of SARS-CoV-2 (known as 20C/501Y.V2 or B.1.351 lineage) emerged independently of the B.1.1.7 lineage. This variant shares some mutations with the B.1.1.7 lineage. Cases attributed to this variant have been detected outside of South Africa.

CDC, in collaboration with other public health agencies, is monitoring the situation closely. CDC is working to detect and characterize emerging viral variants. Furthermore, CDC has staff available to provide on-the-ground technical support to investigate the epidemiologic and clinical characteristics of SARS-CoV-2 variant infections. COVID-19 Vaccine Distribution

County Health Departments (CHDs) are administering COVID-19 vaccine to persons 65 years of age and older. CHDs may require you to register for an appointment. Please check your CHD or county government's website for more information.

- ⇒ **Citrus**– A drive-thru clinic from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., or until supplies last, on Saturday, Jan. 9, at the Central Ridge District Park, 6905 N. Lecanto Hwy in Beverly Hills. Each person must provide a valid ID and plan to be in Citrus County to receive their second-round shot, 28 days after the first dose. As more vaccines become available, additional dates will be announced. - ⇒ **Hardee**- **Appointments for vaccinations are filled through January 22nd**. No more appointments are being accepted at this time. Planning is underway for additional dates. They are requesting those who wish to make an appointment wait until next week to contact the scheduling number (863-773-4161).
- ⇒ **Hernando**- Appointments have reached capacity. **Further appointments are not being made at this time**. As the appointment schedule opens, new appointments will be made. Those persons who have already left a message will be contacted in the order their message was received. - ⇒ **Manatee-** **Appointments are now fully booked.** Manatee County will be implementing a new COVID-19 vaccine standby process that will allow seniors ages 65 and older to avoid waiting lines by pre-registering by phone or online with the County if they're interested in receiving vaccines beginning to arrive locally. The public will be able to access the registration form online 24/7, beginning at 10 p.m. on Thursday, Jan. 7. You can also register by calling 311 between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. on weekdays beginning Friday, Jan. 8. [View more vaccination information.](#)
- ⇒ **Pasco-** The drive-thru vaccination clinic is at Sears in the Gulfview Square Mall located at 9409 US Hwy. 19, Port Richey, FL 34668. [Registration](#) will open 24 hours prior to the day in which you would like to schedule an appointment. *****Due to the limited supply of vaccines that Pasco County Health Department has received, we have not scheduled any vaccination clinics after Friday, Jan. 8, 2021.** More information [here](#).
- ⇒ **Pinellas-** At this time, **they are not accepting new appointments**, as have expended the supplies of vaccine to offer. Once additional doses are received, they will open the reservation system to the public again. Watch for updates at Pinellas.floridahealth.gov.
- ⇒ **Polk-** DOH- Polk is launching a COVID-19 vaccine hotline that will begin taking calls Friday morning at 8 a.m. The phone line, (863) 298-7500, will be manned for the foreseeable future by staff from both the Florida Department of Health and Polk County Board of County Commissioners from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, starting 1/8/20. Employees staffing the hotline will register residents 65 years of age and older for a limited number of vaccine appointments scheduled for next week. Once those initial appointments are filled, callers 65 years old and older can be placed on a registration list for a future vaccine appointment, as additional vaccine becomes available. Those who are eligible for the vaccine, 65 years old and older, may call the line to provide their information and ask questions of staff. Please continue to monitor this [website](#) for updates.
- ⇒ **Sumter**— Sumter CHD will be hosting COVID-19 vaccination events on [Monday 1/11/21](#) & [Wednesday 1/13/21](#). Coronavirus Vaccine at Publix

Through a partnership with FDEM and FDOH, Publix is receiving 15,000 doses of the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine to launch a new pilot program at 22 select Publix Supermarkets, beginning Friday, January 8. HHS Announces \$22 Billion in Funding to Support Expanded Testing, Vaccination Distribution

The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) today announced two upcoming actions by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to provide more than \$22 billion in funding to states, localities, and territories in support of the nation's response to the COVID-19 pandemic, as directed by the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act. Funding will provide critical support for testing and vaccination-related activities to jurisdictions before January 19, 2021. Read more [HERE](#).

Disinfectant Sprayer Distribution Starts Monday, January 11th!

The Epix 360 Electrostatic Disinfectant Sprayers that were purchased for our member LTC facilities and partners have arrived. Eligible receiving facilities will receive an email to coordinate pick up and/or delivery. Distribution will begin on Monday, January 11th in Pinellas County at the TBHMPC warehouse from 10am - 2pm. Details and location have been sent to eligible members. During the remainder of the week of January 11th and 18th, we will be distributing these systems along with 5 gallons of the ProKura V disinfectant solution to all eligible members in our region. PAPR Training with Code Pinke Crisis Planning



Statewide Conference Calls

State Florida Hospital Association/Hospital Call, 0/05/2021—These calls will once again be occurring weekly, Tuesdays at 10am.

State Surgeon General Dr. Rivkees:

- On average most individuals become infectious 5-10 days after exposure, then another 5-10 days for symptoms, and then another week to potentially need hospitalization
- Those who are vaccinated need to continue to wear a mask until we have a better understanding of the impact of vaccination on the virus.
- Continue to monitor staff for symptoms and they should not work when ill
- Monoclonal antibodies have proven efficacy in decreasing one's chance of having to be hospitalized
- We have sent out updates via MQA, and if you need more doses of monoclonal antibodies, please let FDOH know. Also, we want to know more about outcomes/hospitalizations for those who receive this these. Please reach out to FDOH to let them know.
- The UK strain is 50% more transmissible. It is susceptible to the monoclonal antibody treatment and the vaccine is effective against it.
- FDA issued a statement that vaccine is to be used according to EUA and providing only one dose is NOT an option.
- Please document vaccines given into FL SHOTS within 24 hours of administration.
- Adverse events need to be reported through VAERS
- Those who received the vaccine are encouraged to download the V-Safe app.
- Allocations of vaccine to hospitals have been based on number of healthcare workers who have direct patient contact plus 15% for healthcare workers in the community
- FL has over 4 million people over the age of 65 and they are one of the priority groups in addition to those who are immunocompromised or have other underlying health conditions.
- Facilities are starting to receive their allocation for the second dose for those who have had their first dose.

AHCA Secretary Harris:

- 7700 hospitalizations, 1400 in ICU, 22.6% hospital bed availability and 19.65% availability for ICU beds
- Please make sure you are updating FLSHOTS system daily and ESS.
- State has procured 1000 nurses to assist with vaccinations in the community. If you need support please let DEM know.

Q & A

- PACMAN Assay –For detection of variant strain N1 and O will be present on the assay but not S1
- What is the process for patients that received their first shot in the facility and then how do they get their second vaccination? The county health department will be setting up second dose vaccine days.
- Is there a process to sign up to get another allotment of vaccine? AHCA –will send out information on how to request additional doses.
- In the new questions, are the total number of individuals vaccinated is this cumulative? AHCA –Report per hospital and yes the number is cumulative for everyone who has been vaccinated.
- Healthcare workers in the community may be able to sign up though some hospitals and some county health departments to receive their vaccination.
- We continue to have limited availability of the vaccine and as it becomes more available we will be able to reach out the community more.
- In ESS only include the number of people you have vaccinated. So if a PRN employee was

vaccinated at another facility, do not include them in their count.

- If someone who has been vaccinated is exposed, they need to follow 14-day quarantine (gold standard, may be shorter time period with testing depending on work duties) and CDC has guidelines and FAQs on this issue.

FHCA Call with LTC Providers and Regulatory Partners—January 7, 2021, 4:15 pm

State Surgeon General, Dr. Rivkees

- As always, appreciate all the things you're doing
- CoVID-19 remains a serious respiratory virus. Research shows those who succumb to the various are mostly over 65.
- None of us know who are pre and a-symptomatic so please wear masks, practice social distancing, encourage frequent handwashing
- Trends: www.floridahealth.gov. For the past week, we are seeing increasing amounts of CoVID-19. Mitigation measures reign supreme. Please continue to screen all visitors, contract workers etc. Each week, more than 1 million new cases, so mitigation is critically important
- New variant of Coronavirus is 50 percent more transmissible, but does not appear to be more virulent. According to the CDC, it makes up less than 1 percent of all cases, but it is in FL
- Non-hospitalized patients who are at risk may be eligible for monoclonal antibodies
- Vaccines: both Pfizer and Moderna require two doses. Pfizer with a 21 day interval and Moderna with 28 days, give or take 3 days
- Allocations to the state come from the federal government
- According to data from AHCA: 46 percent of residents in nursing homes have received at least one dose. Only 20 percent of staff have. This is concerning. Let's improve that rate and have conversations about how to do that.

- LTCF: 3,290 residents are positive, 2,824 staff positive. That equates to some stabilization, but we need to protect our seniors from the impacts of this virus.
- Looking at vaccine uptake rate. We can put out more info re: vaccine hesitancy and staff. We will partner with FHCA and others to address concerns
- Re: shift to CDR Maguire for ALFs: if you received a dose from CVS or Walgreen's already, they will administer the second dose
- Given rising cases: if there's anything we need to do to support you let us know. We can offer infection control support and want to hear about emerging trends you see in your area. Hospitals have been reporting issues with post-acute care, so we are looking for supportive care alternatives for those patients

- ESS entries must be updated daily for staff and residents. Let us know if any questions arise
- Be sure to answer new questions about vaccination

Deborah Franklin, FHCA

- Personal Care Attendant program extended for 60 days. On our webpage, there is a video and lots of info. Many providers report the program has been instrumental to their success in staffing
