September is National Preparedness Month!

In addition to being the peak of hurricane season, September is also National Preparedness Month. This month is observed each September to raise awareness about the importance of preparing for disasters and emergencies that could happen at any time. This year's theme is "Take Control in 1, 2, 3", with a special focus on empowering older adults to prepare for disasters.

The 2023 National Preparedness Month campaign will focus on preparing older adults for disaster, specifically older adults from communities that are disproportionally impacted by the all-hazard events, which continue to threaten the nation.

We know older adults can face greater risks when it comes to the multitude of extreme weather events and emergencies we now face, especially if they are living alone, are low-income, have a disability, or live in rural areas.

Emergency managers and all those who work with and support older adult communities can access the new webpage available in English and Spanish languages at <u>Ready.gov/older-adults</u> and <u>Ready.gov/es/adultos-mayores</u> for initial messaging, graphics and resources.

National Suicide Prevention Month

In recognition of September as National Suicide Prevention Month, the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention (AFSP), is empowering the public by recommending key actions that everyone can take to help save lives in their communities. While suicide prevention matters every day of



the year, National Suicide Prevention Month shines a light on this leading cause of death to connect people with support and to spread the hopeful message that help is available.

In spring 2023, AFSP launched a campaign called <u>Talk Away the Dark</u> that features a <u>public</u> <u>service announcement</u> that shows the impact of a simple, direct dialogue about suicide and how to initiate those conversations to save lives.

There are countless ways to Talk Away the Dark including initiating conversations about mental health, <u>learning the warning signs</u> and <u>risk factors</u>, speaking up and making sure more people know what research reveals about how to prevent suicide, lighting the way for those in distress to feel comfortable asking for help, and knowing what to say to support survivors of suicide loss. <u>U.S. and International Partners Release Report on Russian Cyber Actor Using "Infamous Chisel" Malware</u>

The Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA), Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), National Security Agency (NSA), United Kingdom National Cyber Security Centre (NCSC UK), Canadian Centre for Cyber Security (CCCS), Australian Signals Directorate (ASD), and New Zealand's Cyber Security Centre (NCSC-NZ) released a joint malware analysis report on Infamous Chisel malware used by Sandworm actor targeting Android devices used by Ukraine military.

Infamous Chisel is a collection of components targeting Android devices with capabilities to enable unauthorized access to compromised devices, scan files, monitor traffic, and periodically steal sensitive information. The malware's capability includes network monitoring, traffic collection, network backdoor access via The Onion Router (Tor) and Secure Shell (SSH), network scanning and Secure Copy Protocol (SCP) file transfer.

The malware is attributed to Sandworm, the Russian Main Intelligence Directorate's (GRU's) Main Centre for Special Technologies, GTsST. Network defenders and users are encouraged to review the report for indicators of compromise (IOCs) and detection rules and signatures to determine system compromise.

DHS/CISA and FBI Published Joint Advisory on QakBot Infrastructure

As the nation's cyber defense agency, the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) and the FBI released a joint Cybersecurity Advisory, "Identification and Disruption of QakBot Infrastructure," to help organizations reduce the likelihood of QakBot-related activity and promote identification of QakBot-facilitated ransomware and malware infections.

From recent FBI operations, the advisory provides observed tactics used by threat actors along with several IP addresses assessed to be used to access victim systems. QakBot—also known as Qbot, Quackbot, Pinkslipbot, and TA570—is responsible for thousands of malware infections globally. 3

However, disruption of the QakBot botnet does not mitigate other previously-installed malware or ransomware on victim computers. Therefore, all organizations are recommended to review the advisory and implement recommended mitigations that can help reduce the impact and risk of compromise by malicious cyber actors. Some of the recommended mitigations include apply cross-sector cybersecurity performance goals, use phishing-resistant multifactor authentication and segment networks; review advisory for all best practices listed in the advisory.

Also, organizations are reminded to visit <u>StopRansomware.gov</u> which provides a range of free U.S. government resources and services that can help bolster cyber hygiene, cybersecurity posture and reduce risk to ransomware.
