Florida Health Statewide Pulsara Initiative

The Florida Department of Health is partnering with Pulsara to provide access statewide to their platform, to improve patient tracking and communication within the healthcare community.

Pulsara at a Glance

Pulsara can connect all emergency responders, hospital teams, and health officials in a single, secure network. It is a centralized solution for clear, concise, and quick communication across any incident's scale. It can be used for everyday transports, urgent emergencies, or large-scale crises.

Florida's Strategy for Enhanced Care

Florida's healthcare system has taken a giant leap forward by offering Pulsara statewide—at no cost to organizations. Benefiting from ongoing state funding, a broad coalition of healthcare services, including EMS, hospitals, and fire departments, are welcomed to opt-in.

Having one centralized communication system will help streamline local, regional, and statewide response during disasters. When responders use Pulsara daily, it creates muscle memory, comfort, and confidence to use Pulsara for the large-scale event or MCI.

What stands out with Pulsara? Here's a snapshot:

- Reduce the Chaos: Say goodbye to the "telephone game." With Pulsara, each patient gets a dedicated communication channel, dramatically reducing errors and delays.

Request for Information (RFI): HHS Initiative to Enhance National All Hazards Hospital Situational Awareness

ASPR, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), Centers for Medicare & Medicaid (CMS), and the Office of the National Coordinator for Health Information Technology (ONC) are seeking broad public input from entities across the health care readiness community on a national, all-hazards standardized set of essential elements of information (EEI) and vendor-neutral data collection mechanisms for hospital data that drive action for emergency preparedness and response. This input will inform efforts to provide recommendations for a standardized lens into the readiness of, stress on, and resources available in hospitals before, during, and after emergencies. The public comment period ends on December 18, 2023. Please see the posted RFI for more detail and submission of public comments.

CDC Develops New Toolkits to Prepare for Flu, COVID-19, and RSV

<u>CDC Publishes New Vital Signs on Health Worker Mental Health and Launches new Campaign for Hospital Leaders</u>

In October, CDC released a new Vital Signs highlighting the mental health crisis in health workers. The report, which contains an analysis from the CDC Quality of Worklife survey, focuses on well-being and working conditions, comparing data from 2018 to 2022. The report also compares health workers with essential workers and all other workers across industries. Researchers found that reports of poor mental health symptoms increased more for health workers than for other worker groups.

CDC has also launched the first federal campaign to help hospitals tackle healthcare worker burnout. The new campaign, Impact Wellbeing, provides hospital leaders with evidence-informed resources to improve workplace policies and practices that reduce burnout, normalize helpseeking, and strengthen professional wellbeing.

Additionally, hospital leaders can remove one of the most substantial system barriers to healthcare worker wellbeing—intrusive mental health questions on hospital credentialing applications. Auditing and changing hospital credentialing application questions removes barriers to care and sends a clear message to healthcare workers that their hospital supports their wellbeing and mental health. The Dr. Lorna Breen Heroes' Foundation developed three simple steps hospital leaders can follow to make it safe for their healthcare workers to seek care.
