We encourage all of you promote heart health this month to your staff, patients and clients. There are many national level organizations that have created excellent resources that you can use to share info on cardiovascular health, some of which are summarized below.

The Heart Truth is an educational campaign from the National Heart, Lung and Blood Institute, designed to raise awareness about heart disease as the leading cause of death in women. It provides free, science-based educational materials and information about heart-healthy-living, coordinate American Heart Month, support National Wear Red Day®, and more. It also established the Healthy Hearts Network to expand reach into local communities and collaborate with health and community professionals on heart health education initiatives.



The CDC has put together an <u>American Heart Month</u> toolkit for health care professionals and clinicians to help support their patients, especially women, by listening to their heart. These resources can help your clinical team implement protocols, use data to improve health outcomes, and be inspired by other practices' success stories.

HHS Releases New Voluntary Performance Goals to Enhance Cybersecurity Across the Health Sector

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), through the Administration for Strategic Preparedness and Response (ASPR), released voluntary health care specific cybersecurity performance goals (CPGs) and a <u>new gateway website</u> to help Health Care and Public Health (HPH) sector organizations implement these high-impact cybersecurity practices and ease access to the plethora of cybersecurity resources HHS and other federal partners offer. HHS Home Test to Treat Program Expands Nationwide

The federal government has expanded the <u>Home Test to Treat</u> program, a virtual community health program that offers free COVID-19 health services. Services available to eligible participants nationwide include at-home rapid tests, telehealth sessions, and at-home treatments. With its expansion, the Home Test to Treat program will now offer free testing, telehealth sessions, and treatment for both COVID-19 and for influenza (flu) A and B. Effective July 1, 2024: Acute care hospitals required to join Joint Commission NHSN Group

Beginning July 1, 2024, acute care hospitals with ORYX® performance measurement requirements and that are required through a U.S. Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) program to participate in the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) National Healthcare Safety Network (NHSN) system will be required to join the Joint Commission NHSN Group. Participation in the Joint Commission NHSN Group will be optional for critical access hospitals where participation in CMS programs is not required. The Joint Commission identified the NHSN system as a data source to evaluate patient safety and clinical quality performance by Joint Commission-accredited hospitals — many of which already participate in NHSN as a CMS program requirement. Updated TBHMPC Participation Requirements

TBHMPC has updated the participation requirements for members to receive funding from the Coalition. The new criteria are listed below, and you can learn more at a county Coalition meeting soon!

- Have a current MOA on file
- 50% attendance of county level meeting in person or virtual (camera on to receive virtual credit)
- Participate in at least 2 drills or exercises provided by TBHMPC (each fiscal year)
- Participate in the TBHMPC Communications Drill (June/December)
- Participate in the TBHMPC Regional HVA process
- Timely submission of CEMP
- Be a good community partner (bonus points)

With New Community Garden and Food Pharmacy, Tampa General Hospital and the City of Tampa Advance Health and Wellness Among Area Residents

Marking a significant milestone in the TampaWell initiative, Tampa General and the City of Tampa officially welcomed residents to enjoy the benefits of healthy eating with support from a brand-new community garden and food pharmacy. John Couris, president

and CEO of Tampa General, and Tampa Mayor Jane Castor were joined by community leaders and area residents to cut the ribbon on the new TampaWell Community Garden and Food Pharmacy, both conveniently located at TGH Family Care Center Healthpark, which serves one of the most food insecure neighborhoods in the region.



"We're on a mission to transform the health and wellness of our community. Healthy foods and regular physical activity play a pivotal role in both the prevention and the treatment of chronic health conditions, but not everyone has access to these essentials," said Couris. "With this new community garden and food pharmacy, we're working to ensure that residents of this community can benefit from nutritious foods, contributing to better health and a greater quality of life."

The Food Pharmacy and Community Garden is just one of the many programs offered by TampaWell to connect residents in the region with resources for health and wellness.

TGH Cancer Institute Employs AI in its Newly Established Center for Precision Radiosurgery

The CyberKnife S7 is a robotic, non-invasive radiation therapy device that employs real-time, AI-driven motion tracking and synchronization treatment delivery for stere-otactic radiosurgery (SRS) and stereotactic body radiation therapy (SBRT) treatments. It is capable of treating cancerous and benign tumors throughout the body, as well as neurologic disorders, in as little as 15 minutes. The tool, through its speed and advanced precision, is expected to expand the capabilities of Tampa General Cancer Insti-



tute's newly established Center for Precision Radiosurgery. Read more here.
